

# **DAAP**Self Guided Tour

   The red stickers indicate you are in the correct spot, and rooms will be labeled.
- Feel free to explore a lab or studio if staff is present.
- You can use just this handout to navigate the building if you wish

- Tour takes between 25 to 45 minutes depending on your pace.
- This tour is meant to loop.


### RAPID PROTOTYPING CENTER



### **GRAND STAIRCASE**



Your first stop will be in 1 of 2 places directly in front of you: The Grand Staircase or The Rapid Prototyping Center. Please move forward and look for the sign and continue the video when you're ready.



### 1. DEAN'S OFFICE/STUDENT AFFAIRS (5470) AND DAAP LIBRARY (5480)

- The Admission and advising staff are located in DAAP Student Affairs
- One of the libraries on UC's campus includes an iMac lab, five study rooms available for reservation, plus a collection of 100,000 monographs, bound journals, and hundreds of cutting-edge periodicals.

### **DIRECTIONS:**


Proceed down the hallway adjacent to the library and students affair offices to the Rapid Prototyping Center. There will be a singular door to your left halfway through the hallway. You may resume the tour once your arrive.

### 2. RAPID PROTOTYPING CENTER (5512)

- 5512 Utilizes state-of-the-art computer-driven milling machines, 3D printers, and laser cutters, which are available to students in all DAAP disciplines.
- Students can get hands-on experience next door in the Student Technology Lab (5202), where they can use smaller versions of the equipment found in the RPC. (The student technology lab is room number 5207.)
- 5512 Allows students to bring their designs to physical form for faculty critique as part of the iterative process.

#### DIRECTIONS:

After viewing, please walk adjacent of the RPC until you come upon a hallway to your right filled with lockers. You may resume the tour once you spot this.



### 3. STUDIO (*5245-5265*)

- Studios 5245-5265 house the first year School of Design students. They are representative of what most DAAP studio spaces look like.
- If enrolled in one of our seven studio programs, most of your time will be spent in a studio.
- On average, students spent three hours at a time in their studios for design students.

#### **DIRECTIONS:**


The Tabula Rasa is your next stop and is the gallery located at the end of this hallway.


### 4. TABULA RASA GALLERY (5300)

- Used by our Fine Arts students to display their work all throughout the year.
- Individual fine art studios are behind the tabula rasa gallery in 5310

#### DIRECTIONS:

Take the staircase on your immediate left up to the 7000 level and resume the video once you exit the staircase.







# 5. ARCHITECTURE AND INTERIOR DESIGN STUDIOS (7625-7270)

- The Architecture studios (7625-7270) are on the right, and the Interior Design studios are on the left.
- Every academic semester students make and build a variety of models and projects, work on various drawing exercises and share their projects in DAAP public spaces.
- The average class size in DAAP is 22 students.
- Studio time is for architecture and interior design students.

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Once you arrive at the end of the hallway, take a left and walk past the School of Architecture and Interior Design offices (room 7210) and keep walking until that hallway ends. There will be a set of double doors to your right. Walk through the 2 sets of double doors, take the staircase down to the 6000 level and walk through the next set of double doors. Resume the video once you arrive.







### 6. SCHOOL OF PLANNING (6210)

- This school hosts three undergraduate programs, including Horticulture, Urban Planning, and Urban Studies.
- Courses take a multifaceted approach that reflects the social, physical, economic, environmental, political, health, and legal aspects of the study and planning of communities, landscapes, and environments from local, regional, and global perspectives.
- First year Urban Planning student work is displayed on the right wall and graduate student work on the left.

### **DIRECTIONS:**

Proceed and take a right down the next hallway across from stairwell. Resume the video once you arrive.





# 7. INDUSTRIAL DESIGN STUDIOS HIGHLIGHTS (6245-6275)

- Students are constantly drawing and designing prototypes of a variety of products.
- Houses the Future Mobility Center which includes a collaborative workspace for multidisciplinary work, an advanced visualization lab for traditional 2D development future concepts, and space that mixes virtual reality development with physical prototyping.


### 8. PRINTMAKING LAB HIGHLIGHTS (6335)

- Students learn how to print on a variety of surfaces including wood, glass, textiles, metals, plastic, and paper.
- Space and access is provided for screen printing, relief, intaglio, and lithography.
- This studio is primarily used by our School of Art students.

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Please turn back around and take a right. You will see a small staircase just around the corner. Go up the stairs, take a right and continue down the hallway past the School of Art office (6431). Keep walking until you have the option to turn left. You can stop at the floor marker and resume the video when you arrive.





# 9. FASHION TECHNOLOGY CENTER (6455-6465)

- DAAP's Fashion Technology Center is a collection of labs and studios including the Wearable Futures Lab (6455), Textile Innovation Lab (6461), Product Development Studio (6465), Apparel Production Lab (6405), and four Fashion Studios.
- Students here have access to state-of-the-art tools for apparel and textile design technology, research, and prototyping.

### **DIRECTIONS:**


Please continue down the hallway. The Communication Design studios (6450) are to your right and all along the hallway. You may resume the video once you spot them.

# 10. COMMUNICATION DESIGN STUDIOS HIGHLIGHTS (6450)

- Classes are in graphic design, interaction design, and motion design.
- Courses help students develop critical and visual thinking along with essential design processes.

### **DIRECTIONS:**

Once you reach the end of the studios, take a sharp left into a narrow hallway and keep walking until you reach the staircase on your right. Take that staircase down to the 4000 level and the door will be marked 'Ceramics'. Proceed to the end of this long hallway and the lab will be directly in front of you. Resume the video once you arrive.





# **11. CERAMICS LAB (4300)**

 Students in any DAAP major have access to several dedicated facilities including a plaster lab, glaze lab, raw materials/mixing lab, and electric, gas, and raku kilns.

### **DIRECTIONS:**

You should see a double door entry to a stairwell behind you with a sign on it. Walk all the way down to the floor level until you reach a single door. Exit to your left







### **12. DAAP BUILD LAB (3330)**

- Houses numerous wood and metal working machines, such as saws, drills, welding equipment, hand tools, and work surfaces.
- Divided up into 5 different sections: the build lab, assembly area, metal and plastic area, welding area, and a supervisory office.
- Students will receive all proper training in the first year of their program if using this space.

### **DIRECTIONS:**

Please proceed through the double doors and resume the video once you come to the red car.





# 13. DAAP PHOTOGRAPHY AND PRINT LAB (4440-4470)

- Open to all students in our programs.
- Offers an array of photography, video, and sound equipment that students enrolled in our programs can rent.
- Photos can be developed in one of multiple dark rooms, studio spaces can be rented for special projects, and large-scale printers or plotting services are available for use

### **DIRECTIONS:**


Head back the way you came and walk towards the center of the room. You will see the "DAAP Tour Stop" floor markers in the center of the room where you can resume the video.

### 14. 4000 LVL MAIN ATRIUM

- Many affectionately refer to this area as the "heart of DAAP" partly due to its centralized location and the amenities that surround it.
- The DAAP Bookstore (4433), DAAP Café (4428), and DAAP IT Center (4425) are located here.
- Within the DAAP IT center there is a student help desk where you can request IT support if you're having issues with your own device. You may even see a handful of classes held in this location.

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Please proceed past the square pillar. Once you pass this, follow the arrows on the left-side wall which will point you to your next stop.



### 15. GRAND STAIRCASE

- Studio critiques are held in this space, plus larger events, like the employer sponsored Engaging Emerging Creatives, and DAAPworks.
- Sitting in the staircase loft are "Ethan and Violet", modeled after two former DAAP students and now a permanent fixture in DAAP.


### **16. REED GALLERY (5275)**

- Largest of the DAAP Galleries.
- Located at the heart of the DAAP complex.
- Exhibits outside artists and features the best of the DAAPworks exhibition each year.

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Continue up the ramp and the offices will be on your right. Resume the video once you arrive.
