Between 2013 and 2023, the School of Planning surveyed its alumni to assess their satisfaction with the training effectiveness and program value. The results, including feedback from the 2022-2023 MCP graduating class, are summarized in the table below.

The **University of Cincinnati** conducts independent exit interviews with Graduate students to determine their overall satisfaction.

The graduates of 2022 show **94.7% overall satisfaction** and **100% employment within one year**.

**Public Information on Overall Program Performance**

Starting with the 2023-2024 Master of Community Planning graduates, an internal survey was taken to assess the competencies of the indirect values of student achievement (11 out of 23 responded).

2023-2024 MCP graduates indicated the relevancy of the School of Planning program components to their educational experience.
