Design and Development Planning

This concentration focuses on the intersection of urban form, place and community. The interactions of people, place, and space will be explored in past, present, and future of urban forms, placemaking, multi-scalar spatial and community design, and real estate development.

Environmental Planning

Environmental planning is a sub-discipline in planning. Environmental planning considers the current situation and properly uses natural resources, ecological services, financial capital, energy, and human resources to create sustainable communities that will ensure the health of ecological systems and people, as well as long term quality of life and equity for all.

Community and Economic Development Planning

Community development seeks to improve the quality of life in communities through housing and other revitalization projects that facilitate access to opportunities, building social capital and realization of self-determination. Economic development strives for the same outcomes by focusing on poverty alleviation, attraction and retention of jobs and investments, promoting investment of local capital locally, and increasing the fiscal resources of cities and neighborhoods without pandering to neoliberal capitalism.
